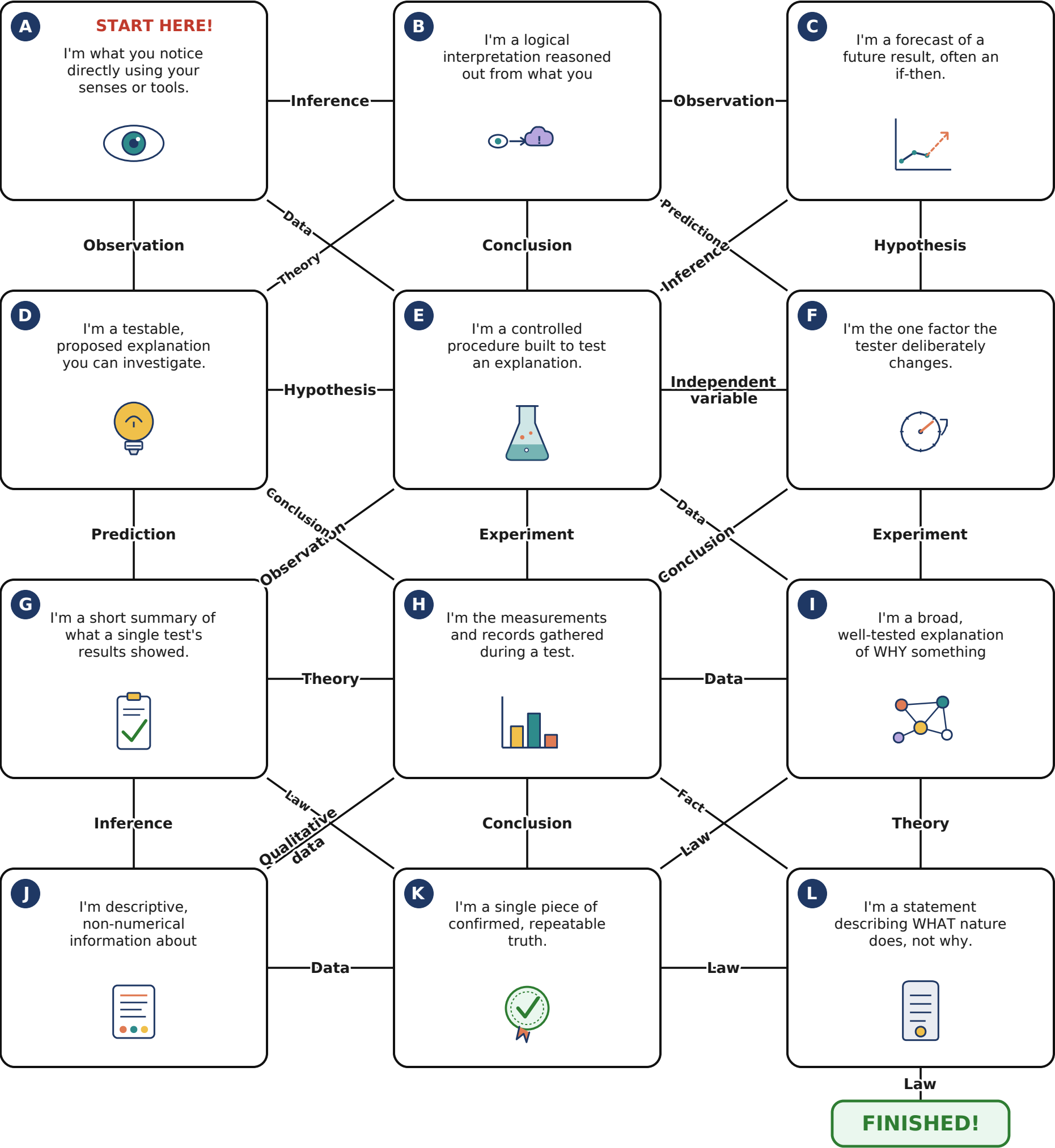


Nature of Science Maze

Begin at START. Name the term, then follow the path labeled with your answer. Continue until FINISHED!

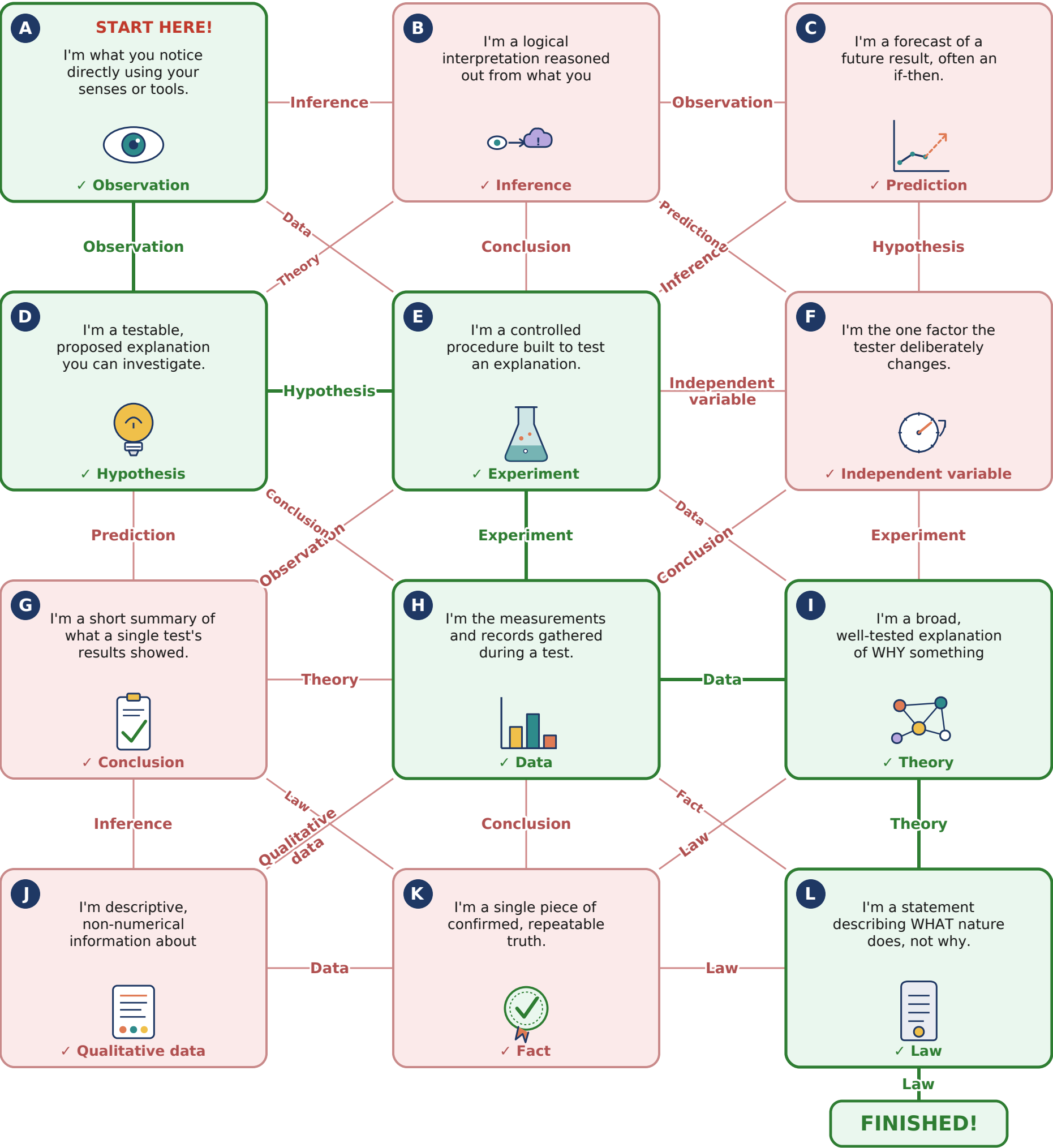
